FROM THE EAST, I-78 to Route 22, exit at downtown Easton (Third St.). Turn right immediately after exiting and proceed up the hill to Lafayette College. At the top of the hill, take the first left onto McCartney Street. Turn left at High Street and follow "CANAL SYMP" signs.

FROM THE WEST, exit Route 22 at Fourth Street. Follow Bushkill Street for one block east. Bushkill Street parallels Route 22. Turn left at the intersection of Third and Bushkill Streets. Proceed up the hill, make first left onto McCartney Street. Turn left at High Street and follow "CANAL SYMP" signs.
